Dennis Clegg, PhD
"Treating Macular Degeneration Using Stem Cells"

Dr. Clegg will discuss the latest advances in stem cell research in the treatment of macular degeneration (age related central visual loss due to retina degeneration). Dr. Clegg earned his BS degree in biochemistry at UC Davis and his PhD in biochemistry at UC Berkley. As a postdoctoral scholar at UCSF, he studied neural development and regeneration. He has continued this avenue of research since joining the UCSB faculty, with a current interest in stem cell research. Dr. Clegg is the recipient of the UCSB Distinguished Teaching Award, has served as Chair of the Department of Molecular, Cellular, and Developmental Biology, is a member of the Neuroscience Research Institute, and is Co-Director for the UCSB Center for Stem Cell Biology and Engineering. #### **Last Meeting:**

#### "A History of Dixieland Jass"



Harry Brown introduced Randolph E. Siple, aka Rooster Siple, as an Historian, musician, attorney, vintner, organic farmer, educator, body surfer, automobile restorer, political activist, radio and TV commentator – Randolph Siple has created. Educated at Stanford with a JD from USC Law School, he private practiced real estate and business litigation law in Ventura until 1995. In 1996, Mr. Siple founded Organic Certifiers, licensed by the state of CA and US Dept. of Agriculture to certify organic operations nationally and internationally. He currently hosts the 1290 AM radio show "The Rooster Crows". His music talents lead with the Trombone, plus an additional twelve instruments in his quiver. Mr. Siple has formed several Swing and New Orleans-style Jass bands...the focus of his Cosmo presentation.

Rooster started his presentation extolling the virtues of hat racks. As a life long skin cancer sufferer, he demonstrated several of his favorites and explained that he had received several nice compliments from ladies in elevators regarding his head ware. He continued with his appreciation of politically incorrect nick names (disapproved by the language police) used and loved by many of his friends and musical greats. Both of these comments set the tone for what followed.

More than one sharp eyed Cosmo member had noticed the spelling of Jass and wondered whether the editorial staff of Crackers had made an error. Rooster quickly answered the question by reciting the history of the term, starting with appropriation of Jass from the common phrase in Chicago clubs when the musicians would fool around with the music and "all that jass". Some in the local community we not thrilled with the type of music and began defacing the local posters by striking of the "J" in the description of the music. In order to counter this trend, the spelling of the word moved to "jasz" or Jazs" and finally landed on "JAZZ". But Rooster liked the earliest form of the description for his presentation, notwithstanding the error made by Ken Burns in his DVD presentation on JAZZ to the contrary.

New Orleans was the birthplace of the genre. Music normally available to folks consisted of classical, folk or martial music. The melting pot of New Orleans, the heat and commercial center, the reputation for loose morals and the strong development of fraternal clubs provided the venue to accept the innovations brought by the "raggie" piano. This was available in both white and black clubs, segregated but equal

in this regard. The development of this music was accelerated by Prohibition and the speakeasy syndrome. The quality of the music of the fraternal clubs was peopled by musicians who all read music. As this moved along, particular players would not attend every event, the ensembles got smaller and the music became less useful because of the absence of all the notated instruments.

Other factors mentioned by Rooster as significant in the spreading of Jazz were the world wide inflation in 1918, World War I and the impact of STD on the troops and culture, and the Depression of 1933. By World War II, the development of Dixieland Jazz was eclipsed by Swing music, a la Benny Goodman, which was in turn facilitated by electric microphones.

Rooster and his wife have free organic wine tasting and Jazz on Sunday afternoons at his home and the site of his winery, The Piper's Winery in Carpentaria. The presentation was fascinating and enjoyed by all.
